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Supply of information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000

- 1 We have received requests for Housing Benefit and Council Tax Benefit (HB/CTB) expenditure and subsidy claimed information on a local authority (LA) basis. Publication of this information is not restricted under the Freedom of Information Act and therefore has been provided.
- 2 The information provided is an extract from the Department's database and includes each authority's name and the amounts entered in each cell of the final subsidy claim form.
- 3 No copies of the subsidy claim forms, the auditors' reports on subsidy claims, or any copies of communications between the Department and any authority have been provided.
- 4 As the information requested is not subject to an exemption under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, we will treat any future requests for the same information in the same way.

'Take Up the Challenge' – tackling child poverty

- 6 Benefits and tax credits are essential to tackling poverty. They provide financial support to make sure that work pays and to help families who cannot work escape poverty. There are an estimated 400,000 children living in poverty who might not be if their families claimed all the benefits and tax credits to which they are entitled. At a time of economic uncertainty, and with new requirements for local partners in the Child Poverty Bill, it is ever more vital that all services play a role in helping vulnerable families to take up all of their entitlements.
- 7 General Information Bulletin G1/2009 contained details of the Take Up Taskforce, who were asking for evidence of ways LAs and their partners can help to tackle child poverty by supporting parents to take up their entitlements to tax credits and benefits.
- 8 The Taskforce has now published its findings. 'Take Up the Challenge' sets out actions that LAs and partners can take now to tackle child poverty by maximising families' incomes, illustrated by case studies of successful local approaches. The report can be viewed and downloaded at www.dcsf.gov.uk/ecm/childpoverty.

- 9 The report is based on eight principles of effective service delivery that should be adopted by local services in order to increase take up. It has a strong focus on integrating take up work into mainstream processes, promoting in-work benefits, working in partnership, and the role that practitioners in a range of professions can play to help parents to access tax credits and benefits in order to escape poverty.
- 10 Following the Taskforce's recommendations a cross-Government delivery group will work to deliver a more customer centred and co-ordinated approach to the delivery of benefits and tax credits, and to produce materials to support local services to take the action in the report. These will be available later in the year.
