Introduction

This project specification has been developed in response to the South West ESF Framework which was developed through the Regional Skills Partnership. Delivery of this specification will contribute towards priority 1 of the ESF National Operational Programme. It also takes into account the fit with local strategies such as the Regional Economic Strategy, the emerging Devon Economic Strategy and the Local Area Agreement and the Devon Regeneration. The specification includes both spatial and thematic targeting. Spatial targeting has been developed from and supports the delivery of the Devon Regeneration Action Plan.

The objective of Priority 1 is to:

- improve the employability and skills of unemployed and inactive people, and tackle barriers to work faced by people with disabilities or health conditions, lone parents, people aged 50 and over, ethnic minorities, people with no or low qualifications, young people not in education, employment or training (NEET) or at risk of becoming NEET, and other disadvantaged groups, including people experiencing multiple disadvantage.

Aims of the Project

The aims of the project are to:

- Reduce the gap in benefit claim rates and employment rates between the priority action areas within the Devon Regeneration Action Plan and the average for Devon by supporting more people into sustainable work; &
- Contribute to a reduction in child poverty in Devon through engaging and supporting workless parents into sustainable work.

It is vital that delivery does not duplicate or displace current activity but builds on the good practice that exists in Devon.

Design and Content

- Indicative Contract Value for the first 3 years - £980,000 to £1,222,000
- Contracts may be extended for up to 2 further years
- Indicative Contract Value for any potential extension – up to £611,000
- Indicative number of participants – 1,000

There is not a set Average Length of Stay. This will vary according to the type of interventions provided and the needs of individual participants. Applicants will need to detail in their applications their proposals for assessing the length of stay required on the project and their methods for managing this. The project is built on the principle of continuous progression and covers a range of interventions from engagement to post employment support. This includes progression routes onto mainstream provision such as Pathways to Work and the New Deals as well as post employment progression into Train to Gain and Apprenticeships.

Also, no set attendance pattern is required. Delivery must meet the needs of the customer group. Benefit regulations cannot be waived.

Definition of activity requirements

Engagement: Engage people who are hard to reach/hard to engage through the use of community based advisers and activity, including, where relevant community development activity. Advisers should be based at neighbourhood level where the claim rate is highest, which is particularly relevant for Exeter and Barnstaple where there are significant variations at sub-ward level. Undertake inclusion/engagement across the target areas using hooks such as sport, environment, family activities, arts, enterprise etc. building on and supporting current activity and resources available, especially through the voluntary and community sector.

Assessment and Identification of Barriers: Once engaged, work with individual participants to enable them to identify and overcome barriers to employment/progression towards employment. These barriers might be work and skills related but could also be due to personal circumstances, debt, poor health, offending, rural isolation, motivation and confidence etc. or a number of these factors. An action plan/personal plan will be required for each participant that will remain in place to be reviewed and built upon throughout the individual's pathway to employment regardless of the activities they undertake. This plan will identify the steps that need to be taken to overcome the barriers identified. These could be interim steps which are then reviewed according to progress or, where appropriate, form a full action plan. In all cases assessment and agreement of next steps must take into account current mainstream DWP/LSC provision and other local/alternatively funded provision. If needs can be met in this way, this is the provision that must be accessed. However, ESF can provide additional support such as mentoring, transport, additional equipment, childcare and other ad hoc needs as appropriate. Where assessment identifies a high risk of the individual

dropping out of the programme on-going mentoring and support should be provided from a named adviser/support worker.

Overcoming Barriers and Skills Acquisition: Provision of activities and interventions to overcome barriers and ultimately to ensure each participant has the necessary level of skills to move into sustainable work. Skills include skills for life, employability skills (e.g. time-keeping, communication, team work, negotiation, following instructions) and vocational skills. The exact nature of the activities undertaken will vary considerably across the range of participants and the support available must therefore be flexible and tailored to individual need. **It is not expected** that all provision/activities to address barriers and gain skills will be sourced from within the programme. In all cases existing mainstream provision, ESF provision via the LSC and other local activity **must be considered**. This is particularly relevant for people on incapacity benefit where it is assumed that the majority of people engaged will be referred to the mainstream DWP provision "Pathways to Work". The precise arrangements for incapacity benefit recipients will need to be agreed with the Pathways to Work provider during post tender negotiations of ESF contracts.

Providers must put forward their menu of potential interventions and support. Some activities will be generic across customer groups but some will be specific to the needs of particular groups, for example:

- Disclosure advice for offenders;
- Specialist support for people with learning disabilities;
- Childcare chats and tasters for parents;
- Holistic support for workless families;

Core activities expected **as a minimum** would include:

- Overcoming the e-challenge, e.g. support to set up an e-mail account;
- Debt and financial literacy advice, including in-work benefit calculations and advice;
- Volunteering activity as a stepping stone to work;
- Enabling Fund - Each project to offer a flexible "enabling fund" to overcome specific barriers to participants entering employment. This could include the need for work clothes and equipment, help with transport costs, childcare, transitional allowances to cover any gap between benefits and the first wage, and to buy in one-off provision that cannot be sourced from elsewhere. Due regard to benefit eligibility must be taken into account.

This fund will only be used where other avenues such as ADF (Jobcentre Plus Adviser Discretion Fund) have been explored and are not applicable.

This fund will not be paid separately, so Providers will need to ensure that it is built into their contract costs.

- Gaining employability skills;
- Motivation and confidence building, raising aspirations; &

- Employability package that leads to an Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network award (ASDAN awards are available via LSC).

Transition to Work/Into Work support: The provision will include work focussed and work based activity such as:

- Jobsearch skills and Jobsearch support;
- Support for self-employment;
- Work tasters, work experience and work trials;
- A 1-2 week pre-employment courses linked to specific recruitments that have a guaranteed interview, adding value to and supporting Local Employer Partnerships. Typically these will support participants through the recruitment process, build motivation and confidence and knowledge of the employer/sector, involve a work taster or work-place visit and fully prepare participants for interview (including where appropriate personal grooming, suitable clothes etc.);
- It is anticipated that pre-employment vocational training routeways will be delivered by the LSC.
- Acquisition of relevant certificates and permissions e.g. CSCS cards, food hygiene certificates, insurances etc.;
- Debt and financial literacy advice including budgeting for the transition from benefits into work, better-off-in-work calculations and support to access and stabilise claims for tax credits, changes to housing benefits etc. Assessment of need for transitional allowance and planning for long-term financial stability in work e.g. ongoing saving with credit union;
- Employer engagement activity to gain commitment for Local Employer Partnership activity (pre-recruitment courses), to promote the benefits of a diverse workforce and gain commitment to recruiting priority customer groups;
- Other activities and interventions to meet the needs of participants

Post Employment Support: Wherever possible it is anticipated that participants will move into work with ongoing training and/or personal development. This might be through links to mainstream provision such as Train to Gain, apprenticeships or into an employers' work-based training programme. In all cases, the provision of post employment support to both new employees and employers must be offered. The exact nature and intensity of that support should to be agreed according to the individuals concerned. Examples of post employment support might include:

- Ongoing mentoring and advisory support for new recruits;
- A helpline or more in depth advisory service for employers to help resolve any issues or concerns that arise;
- Provision of incentives to employers such as wage subsidies; &
- Support for training that cannot be accessed through the LSC or other funded routes.

The overall programme is intended to give participants the best possible experience on a pathway to employment, recognising that the length and

intensity of that pathway will vary considerably according to individual need. There should also be flexibility to ensure that ESF activity supports the training and development needs arising from ERDF and other economic regeneration plans. Delivery should be flexible, innovative and of the highest quality to inspire people to participate and secure sustainable work.

Target Groups

The target groups are workless people in target areas listed below and workless parents across Devon County Council area (i.e. not in Plymouth or Torbay).

Priority groups in the target areas are:

- Long term incapacity benefit recipients (subject to discussion with Pathways to Work provider);
- Workless parents and carers;
- People with multiple barriers to progression (e.g. offenders, long term unemployed); &
- Other workless people including people at risk of becoming workless through large scale redundancies.

Provider to provide quarterly report to show progress towards 65/35 split.

Part time workers and eligibility

JSA clients would be eligible if working less than 16 hours per week.

Clients on inactive /other benefits they would need to be working less than 8 hours.

Geographical Coverage

Delivery will be across the Devon County Council area (i.e. not in Plymouth or Torbay) for workless parents (as defined above).

Workless persons or victims of large scale redundancies in the following priority areas will also be able to access the provision:

Westward Ho

Ilfracombe

Barnstaple

Bideford

Rural Torridge (i.e. Torridge District outside of Westward Ho and Bideford)

Princetown

Exeter

Tiverton

Seaton

Dawlish

Teignmouth

Newton Abbot

NB: These are the priority areas within Devon County Council's Regeneration Action Plan and are also areas with above average working age benefit claim rates.

Eligibility

Any person of working age living in one of the 12 priority areas who is not working, will be eligible for this project. Please note that 65% of participants will be from the priority target groups 1 -3 listed above.

Additionally, any parent in Devon County Council area who is not working or who is the victim of a large scale redundancy and who is not living in one of the 12 priority areas. (A parent is defined as someone with dependant children 0-school leaver or parents of young people who are NEET.)

Referrals

The Provider will be responsible for all recruitment and must have a robust recruitment and marketing strategy to support this. Jobcentre Plus will be encouraged to make referrals.

Coherence and context with other provision

It is expected that Skills for Life qualifications (including ESOL), Employability Skills qualifications and vocational training will be delivered through LSC co-financing and mainstream provision. Where it can be evidenced that the qualification based needs of an individual cannot be met through this route, or through any other funded activity, this provision may be delivered as part of this project or brought in on a needs basis through the enabling fund.

It will be acceptable for people to be on an ESF Prime programme and a mainstream provision at the same time, but the provider will clearly have to show the added value.

It will not be acceptable for participants to be on two DWP ESF Prime programmes at the same time.

Participants may be on an LSC ESF Prime programmes and a DWP ESF Prime programmes at the same time when the rationale to be on both can be clearly shown.

Networking/Links

Capacity Building: In each target community build (or add value to an existing network/partnership) a local partnership/network of current organisations, support agencies, public, private and voluntary and community sector (VCS) groups who have/could have a role to play in addressing worklessness and economic inclusion. Provide resources, co-ordination and multi-agency training as appropriate to facilitate organisations working together to provide holistic support for workless people and their families. The aim is that changing the way organisation work together will be sustainable and outlast any particular funding stream or project

Marketing

The Provider will be responsible for recruitment and must have a robust recruitment and marketing strategy to support this (including marketing of Jobcentre Plus in each location). There is a marketing section in the generic specification, which will provide more detail. Marketing arrangements must be agreed locally by Jobcentre Plus to ensure they fit with the wider marketing strategy for our customers.

Funding Model Ratio/Volumes

The funding model ratio for this contract will be 50% Delivery Payment and 50% on achievement of Job Outcomes – further information about the funding model can be found in the generic specification.

Indicative minimum number of participants – 1,000

Indicative minimum number of job outcomes – 250

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We also anticipate a range of other soft outcomes to be achieved.

The successful bidder will be required to provide management information, on a quarterly basis, to show progress against agreed planning assumptions and on the number of disadvantaged parents and carers supported. In addition, information will be required on capacity building projects linked to Neighbourhood Action Teams (NAT), good news stories, lessons learnt, barriers to delivery and partnership links.

We will also require information on the number of people who leave the project without going into work that have taken part in Jobsearch activity. Soft outcomes and other information that is relevant to support the delivery of LAA's will be agreed at the Post Tender stage.

Annex 1 Devon District Overview

Devon

Devon is a large geographic county, which include economically vibrant urban patches and places of considerable deprivation. There are rural areas, which are isolated due to a lack of public transport, and others whose economy is regulated by the tourist season. Devon owns spectacular coastal areas of outstanding natural beauty and two National Parks. The environment is a major asset and is a driver of future economic success. Devon has three prisons and a disproportionate number of offenders opt to resettle in our district.

The vast majority of employers operate within a locally dominated economy. Their skills needs are dictated by the local labour market and serviced by locally based education and learning providers.

The Devon and Cornwall Jobcentre Plus District covers the two counties of Devon and Cornwall, and the Isles of Scilly. There are three significant urban centres – Plymouth, Exeter and Torbay.

We expect the labour market to be buoyant with a continued high number of vacancies in retail, care, hospitality and tourism. Construction will continue to be a growth sector.

Migrant workers are filling many low skilled jobs in production work, care, hospitality and construction where we traditionally find it difficult to find labour. This is likely to continue, but we may see more migrant workers progressing into more skilled jobs

Devon Jobcentres

There are Jobcentre Plus offices in Axminster, Barnstaple, Bideford, Brixham, Devonport, Exeter, Exmouth, Honiton, Ilfracombe, Kingsbridge, Newton Abbot, Okehampton, Plymouth City, Plympton, Sidmouth, Tavistock, Tiverton, Torquay, Totnes.

Local Authorities

The three Local Authorities in Devon are: Devon County Council, Plymouth City Council and Torbay Council.

Areas of Deprivation

The most deprived areas in Devon are Ilfracombe Central, St Peter and the Waterfront, Roundham-with-Hyde and Tormohu. Other targeted areas are: Westward Ho, Ilfracombe, Barnstaple, Bideford, Rural Torridge, Princetown, Exeter, Tiverton, Seaton, Dawlish, Teignmouth, Newton Abbot, Stonehouse, Devonport, North Prospect, Morice Town, Keyham, Mutley and Greenbank,

Barne Barton, East End, Plymouth City Centre, Ernesettle, Stoke, and Whitleigh Efford
